  - Randel Sink gave a summary of how he, Jerry Gunter and Carl Lawrence first learned of proposal of site 14, New Hill, for the WRF:
    - David Cook, County Manager explained to group the development of the 1997-98 WRF conception and planning. Sewage/water planning began because they were drawing water from Jordan Lake. Wake Co., Cary, Morrisville, Apex and Holly Springs partnered, gave Cary the lead agency; Wake Co. stepped out of picture December 2004 – because of funding from water/sewage rates, Wake Co. gave Cary the role.
